Have strong interpersonal skills.

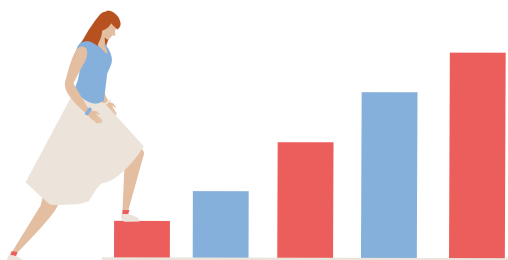
So, if this sounds like you, adult training is likely your calling!
